The church staff from the custodian to the secretary did a great job preparing for this big night of worship. Thank you, staff members! The choir did a wonderful job, as always, as did the musicians. Thank you, choir! And the Handbell Choir hit their number spot on, too. Thank you, Handbell Choir! I heard so many positive and encouraging comments after the service that I was blown away! Even Bishop Johnson was impressed with our church and Cluster tonight. We made a very positive impression on her and our District Superintendent, too. Thank you very much, everyone! I am very proud of Stroudsburg United Methodist Church!

This all left me thinking... First, that I am very honored and privileged to serve as your pastor in this church. It truly is my pleasure to be working with you! Second, I am so proud of how this church works together, not just among ourselves, but also in our community and with other churches. Third, Family Promise was here tonight, too, and I am so proud that SUMC is behind this mission and so many other missions. And, lastly, this all left me with the

feeling that we are definitely doing some things right!

Our ministries are doing very well. Family Promise, for example, has helped 24 families (26 adults and 42 children) since July of 2011! During this time 12 additional families received case managed support to enable them to remain in their homes or find better places to live. The success of this important ministry in our county is very high and we should be very proud to be part of Family Promise because it is making a big difference in the lives of families right here in our community! Thank you to everyone who is helping by staying overnight, providing meals, setting up, etc. I know it is a lot of work, but it is working and it is making a difference!

And did you know that we now have 21 people signed up for the church softball team? Small Groups are increasing in number and existing ones are getting stronger! The Youth Group just participated in the 30-Hour Famine and raised over \$1,700 to help fight world hunger! And the Missions Team helps supports missions and missionaries all over the world!

God is indeed blessing the ministries of this church in some mighty and amazing ways! This is success!

Okay, so what's next?

Daniel's Dream Team developed some goals for 2012 that map out what our next steps should be for our church. In addition, the Bishops' initiative helped us further develop some goals for the next five years.

So, here are our next steps:

SUMC Goals for 2012

1 - Increase the number of special service Sundays, at a minimum have 2 "Bring a Friend" Sundays (Membership & Evangelism)

2 - Establish an Outreach Committee responsible for all promotional activities of the church and have the committee increase the promotion of the church

3 - Establish 1 new, permanent Sunday School class and recruit two new Sunday School teachers (Education Committee)

4 - Establish 2 new small groups (Small Groups Team)

5 - Each group/team/committee get at least one new person involved that is not involved in any other group/team/committee (All Small Groups & Committees)

6 - SUMC responsible for Sunday Soup Kitchen for 6 Sundays

7 - Hold a Ministry Fair in September that connects people to the ministries of the church (Daniel's Dream Team)

8 - Elevator and related changes to the interior structure are completed before the end of the year (Property & Building)

Look this list over more carefully again.

Do you see an area or ministry that matches up with your gifts, interests, and passions? By committing to help in one of these next steps you will be helping SUMC accomplish our goals for the year. But here's the catch - we need you!

Daniel's Dream Team cannot do this alone. The administrative teams cannot do this alone. And the other ministry groups cannot do this alone.

We need more people to get involved in the ministries of the church.

Let me say this again: **We need more people to get involved in the ministries of the church!**

So, take this page out of your newsletter or print from the electronic version and put it in your Bible. Use it for a bookmark. Do whatever you can to keep these goals in front of your eyes during your daily devotions.

Find at least one goal that you can help with this year. For example, we are looking for at least one new permanent Sunday School class. Can you help teach such a class? I've been thinking about teaching a Sunday School class over this coming summer with the title "Stories Behind the Music." Many of our hymns have a background story that the author used to write the lyrics for these great hymns. Knowing these background stories can help us better appreciate the meaning of these words. 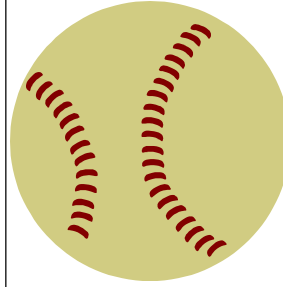

Joyful news!! Our giving income through the month of January 2012 was up by 6.2% or \$1,064.58 over last year. Thank you to all who have given so generously. All bills YTD, including our Conference apportionment are paid. Praise the Lord!

Through the month of January, 2012 we had \$1,905.00 donated through giving envelopes for the elevator project. To date a total of \$242,635.31 has been donated through envelope giving and memorials. February 9 another payment of \$29,376.00 was paid to Edinger Construction for work completed on the project for a total of \$269,295.00 having been paid. Our estimated balance due Edinger Construction is \$97,070.00. Again, thank you to all who have financially supported this project. We ask our membership to prayerfully consider what you can give.

The 2012 budget was adopted by the Charge Conference on February 12. A copy of the budget, for your information, has been included in the Courier.

Per the direction of The Book of Discipline of the Methodist Church an audit of all financial accounts of the church was completed the end of January. All accounts were found to be in order with a few minor record keeping suggestions made. Thank you to all treasurers for your cooperation in providing your financial data and to Dan Butz, Kirsten Lee, Ruth Weber and Carole Everitt for serving on the audit committee.

If you did not receive your 2011 giving statement please notify the church office. All statements not emailed or picked up were mailed on January 27.

The Stewardship Committee would like to thank JoAnn Calkins for her faithful service to our committee. 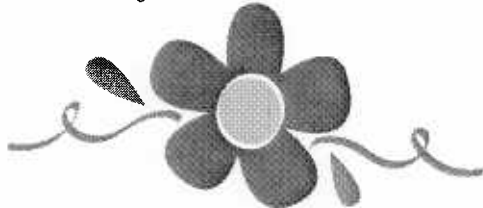
