## STEWARDSHIP

Factoring out donations designated for the elevator and memorials through the month of October we have a \$53,547.21 shortfall in income versus expenses for the year. Fortunately we have been able to pay all bills including our Conference Apportionment due to Property and Building supplementing our income to meet our expenses. Interest income on P&B funds through October is \$93,201.99. These past few weeks with the plumbing issues at SUMC reinforces the need for emergency monies to be available. The total figure for the sewer problem is not yet available. As we consume P&B funds for our everyday operations we are reducing emergency as well as general maintenance funding available to our church. Please give prayerful consideration as to how you can aid this financial challenge.

The final payment of \$41,685.00 for the elevator was paid to Edinger Construction on November 10 for a total of \$369,010.00 for the project. Through memorials, designated for the elevator, and general giving toward the elevator through October, \$290,138.31 has been donated toward this project with a deficit of \$78,871.69 due to P&B funds for total payment of the project. Thank you to all who have been giving so generously and faithfully to this project. Thank you to all who have submitted a pledge of your time, talent and treasures to SUMC for 2014. If you have not done so, please consider making a commitment to SUMC. Extra commitment cards are available in the back of the sanctuary. The Stewardship Committee has completed the proposed budget for 2014 to be voted on at a Charge Conference scheduled in December. Upon that vote, the budget will be available to the congregation.

Giving Envelopes for 2014 are ready to be picked up in the Fellowship Room. If you know of a neighbor or friend that is unable to pick up their envelopes the Stewardship Committee asks for your assistance in delivering the envelopes. Please let the church office know if we missed your name in the labeling process and would like to receive envelopes.

The Stewardship Committee asks for your continued prayers for our church and its growth as well as for our committee as we oversee the finances of SUMC.
