

Moving Forward

So, we are moving forward. In the second week of this current sermon series I challenged us to imagine and dream bigger. Many times, as adults, we lose the ability to imagine. Children can help us here because for children, the sky is the limit when it comes to imagining!

Imagine what would happen if we doubled everything we do at SUMC. What would it look like if we doubled attendance at 8:30 AND 11:00 worship? What if we doubled the Choir, Cherub Choir, Worship Leaders, Greeters, Ushers, and Media Operators? What if we doubled our Sunday School? What if we doubled our

mission involvement? What if we doubled UMW and UMM? What if we doubled our youth ministry?

I believe God is calling us to more and to move forward! In that same sermon, I shared a new vision to help us move forward. This new vision includes the following elements:

1. Dedicating individuals, families, & our community to God
2. Relevant worship with attendance of 300 during the week
3. Making a difference through Mission (local, global, and hands-on)
4. Spiritual growth opportunities to build and grow faith

These elements can be summed up in the following vision statement:

Dedicating our community to God through relevant worship, hands-on missions, and spiritual growth.

INSTRUCTIONS ON HOW TO CRY - BY KAREN VAUGHN

“And behold, a woman in the city, who was a sinner..brought an alabaster flask of fragrant oil..... and stood at His feet behind Him weeping and she began to wash His feet with her tears, and wiped them with her hair of her head and kissed his feet and anointed them with the fragrant oil”

Luke 7:37-38 NKJV

Stewardship

Through the end of 2013 our expenses exceeded our income by \$75,862.71. Of that amount \$41,685.00 was for our final payment for the elevator project leaving us with a deficit of \$34,177.71 for general and property and building expenses. Thankfully, all bills including our apportionment are paid to date through the financial aid of our property and building funds.

Thank you again to all who have continued to financially support the elevator project. With that support and a generous memorial donation toward the elevator this past month we have \$68,367.69 remaining to fully fund the elevator.

The 2014 budget was adopted by a charge conference vote on January 19. A copy of the budget is included in this Courier. Please direct any questions you may have concerning the budget to any member of the Stewardship Committee. The committee thanks all who have submitted a pledge card toward the 2014 budget. A total of 50 pledges for \$117,220.00 have been received to date. For our 2013 only 35 pledges were received for a total of \$78,122.00. What a blessing that we are moving in a positive direction of commitment.

Giving statements will be emailed or mailed around January 22. If you do not receive a statement or have a question in regard to your statement please contact the church office.

The annual audit, per *The Discipline*, of all church financial accounts was completed in January with an annual report submitted to the Conference. All accounts were found to be in order. A big thank you to the audit committee, Dan Butz, Kirsten Lee and Bob Dellicker, for the excellent job they did. Thank you also to committee treasurers for their cooperation with the audit process.

The Stewardship Committee asks for your continued prayers for our church and its growth as well as for our committee as we face the financial challenges for 2014.
