Advent

Advent is the church season consisting of the four Sundays before Christmas, and through Christmas Eve. Advent, by a word, is not mentioned in the Bible, but the concept is certainly present.

The word "Advent" comes from the Latin word "adventus," which means "coming." The Greek word used in the New Testament is "parousia," and means "coming" or "presence," and most usually refers to the second coming of Jesus.

There are two ways to look at and understand the season of Advent. First, it is the preparation of Christ's birth in Bethlehem and looking back into the past of what happened then. This preparation is reflected in many of the prophetic writings of the Old Testament but also includes the timeline of events leading up to the birth of Jesus. Second, the season of Advent is eschatological, meaning that it can also refer to the second coming of Jesus sometime into **our** future.

Most of us are comfortable and used to thinking and celebrating Advent in the first way. We identify with the preparation of Jesus' birth. Most mothers can identify with Mary, and most fathers can identify with Joseph, as they were making arrangements for their first child's birth. We also can identify with the shepherds' fear as they were greeted by angels singing in their fields that holy night! (If I was one of those shepherds, I would have probably said, "Holy cow!" or should that be "Holy sheep!?") All of these kinds of events make sense to us and they are found in the Bible. Besides, many of us are most comfortable with what we already know or learned previously.

So how can we celebrate the Advent Season in the second way--celebrating the hope and expectation of Jesus' second coming?

Well, the neat thing here is that it makes it so relevant to us today. We know about the past preparations of Mary, Joseph, and the others, but that doesn't have a whole to do with us directly. The second-coming, however, has everything to do with us! First of all, we have to be ready! Are you prepared for Christ's return? Do you have your life and your soul in good order? Are you a strong, faithful believer who is ready to greet your judgment day before the Lord? Looking at Advent in this way, requires us to make proper preparations. It has much more to do with us!

I like to incorporate both ways of understanding and celebrating the Advent Season. After all, there is great joy in singing the shepherds' songs or thinking about Mary's smile. Advent, to me at least, would be missing something if we did not recall these past events. But I also like to include the future sense of Advent when celebrating it this month. I have to ask myself the hard questions: Am I ready? Have I made all the necessary preparations for Jesus' coming?

Here's wishing you have a wonderful Advent celebration this year!

2 cups flour


2 tsp. baking soda


